Our MileCatcher Voyages are a unique initiative to allow sailing enthusiasts the opportunity to accrue sea miles while learning valuable offshore sailing skills under the tuition of Sunsail's professional instructors. Completion of a Sunsail MileCatcher Voyage gives you the ability to log approximately 500 NM of sea time.

Inclusions: All on-board tuition, accommodation (bedlinen and bath towels included) and meals are included for the duration of the voyage. Transfers and personal costs incurred during any stopovers enroute are at the individual expense of each student.

OVERVIEW

The Sunsail MileCatcher Voyages run regularly aboard Sunsail's fleet of luxury Beneteau and Jeanneau yachts, between a variety of Queensland coastal destinations including Southport, Port Douglas, Lizard Island, Cape York and Hamilton Island. In a completely interactive environment, you will learn techniques in coastal navigation, sail handling, rope work, watch keeping, safety precautions, meteorology and much, much more.

WHAT TO BRING

Sun protection (hat, sunscreen, long sleeved light sun shirt, polarised sunglasses), warm clothing, wet weather gear, swimwear, beach towel, soft white-soled shoes or non marking deck shoes, camera, CDs, any alcoholic beverages you may wish, personal toiletries, any medication you may require, one set of smart/casual wear for evenings ashore, personal snorkelling gear (if you have your own). Soft luggage is preferable as space is limited, please pack lightly.

NOTES

The ingredients for meals are supplied on the MileCatcher Voyages. Preparation of meals and cleanliness of the vessel is the students' responsibility and part of the MileCatcher course. A roster system will be designed at the beginning of the course and each student is expected to prepare meals or do chores as required on the roster.



MileCatcher Voyages

Sunsail MileCatcher Voyages run regularly throughout the year aboard our fleet of luxury Beneteau and Jeanneau yachts and cover some of the most untouched and beautiful Queensland coastal sailing grounds. In a completely interactive environment, you will learn techniques in coastal navigation, sail handling, rope work, watch keeping, safety precautions, meteorology and much more.

MILECATCHER TRAINING VESSELS

The majority of our courses are held aboard Sunsail's Jeanneau or Beneteau yachts, which contain galleys, saloons and sleeping cabins. Sunsail always try to allocate double cabins to people who are travelling together (we usually have one couple per course) or who are at least of the same sex. However this cannot be guaranteed and all students should be aware that they may have to share a cabin with another student that they do not know. The instructor is responsible for allocating the cabin arrangements on the first day of the course and allocation cannot be booked in advance.

The vessel will be in a clean and tidy state, is comfortable and has all facilities that are required for students to live on board. The vessel's bathrooms may not be used while berthed at Hamilton Island Marina (as per Marine Park regulations). There are full toilet and shower facilities located at the marina close to the Sunsail dock.

WHAT TO EXPECT ONBOARD

All students play a very active role throughout every MileCatcher Voyage. Every student will assume the role of skipper, under the guidance of Sunsail Instructors, for a minimum two days of the trip and be active crew members for the remainder. At least two nights of the voyage will be spent night sailing, which is an important part of sail training.

Students are also expected to maintain the yacht in a clean and tidy manner and are responsible for the preparation of meals using ingredients provided as part of course cost. Students must bring their own alcoholic beverages if desired.

STOPOVERS

While MileCatcher Voyages are valuable for sail training, you will have plenty of time to enjoy the magnificent cruising areas. At least two nights are spent on the Great Barrier Reef (weather permitting) with lots of great snorkelling opportunities.

While the MileCatcher Voyages do not follow strict itineraries, due to weather limitations, the following destinations are typically included on every trip:

The Whitsunday Islands, Magnetic Island, Palm Island Group, Hinchinbrook Island, Dunk Island, Fitzroy Island, Great Barrier Reef.

Depending on the schedule and weather, the crew may choose to dine ashore for one or two nights during the voyage (eg, Magnetic Island or Dunk Island). Any such meals ashore are at the personal expense of individual students.

EMBARK/DISEMBARK TIMES

If you are starting your MileCatcher trip on Hamilton Island, the vessel will be ready for boarding at 5pm the day before the MileCatcher departs Hamilton Island.

ie. If you booked a MileCatcher that goes from the 4th to the 14th of June you will be able to board the vessel at 5pm on the 3rd of June.

You will be required to disembark the vessel no later than 10am on the last day of the course.

ie. in the case of the above example, 10am on the 14th of June.

If you have a late flight or check in at your hotel we are happy to store your luggage for you on the vessel until such time as you are ready to depart.

GETTING THERE

Closest airport - Hamilton Island.

You can fly to Hamilton Island directly from Brisbane, Sydney and Melbourne with Jet Star. You can also fly to Hamilton Island from Brisbane each day with Virgin Blue. Qantas fly in from Cairns daily and Brisbane on some days of the week.

Transfers - You should always provide your arrival details to our reservations staff so they can arrange for a Sunsail staff member to pick you up on arrival to Hamilton Island and transfer you down to our base. Transfer time is 5 minutes.

There is also an Airport on the mainland at Proserpine, which is the closest airport to Airlie Beach.

Transfers - There is a ferry service between Shute Harbour (10 mins from Airlie Beach) and Hamilton Island. Once you arrive on Hamilton Island one of our staff will meet you at the ferry terminal and transfer you to our base. Transfer time from Ferry Terminal on Hamilton Island is 3 minutes.

GETTING THERE

Closest airport - Cairns International Airport

Transfers: From Cairns International Airport to Port Douglas, Sun Palm Bus Company operates a local shuttle services around Port Douglas at 15-minute intervals throughout the day between 7:00am and 1:00am the following morning it will take you from the airport to Marina Mirage. If you would like to make a booking in advance of your arrival to Cairns the telephone number is 07 4084 2615.

MileCatcher Destinations

Horn Island

Located at the northernmost point of Queensland, in the Torres Strait, between the mainland and Papua New Guinea, this remote area of Australia is rich in natural beauty, culture and history.

DEPARTURE ADDRESS

Thursday Island.

There is no Marina at Thursday Island so the vessel will be anchored out the front of the Jardine Hotel just off the town.

EMBARK/DISEMBARK TIMES

If you are starting your MileCatcher trip On Horn Island, the vessel will be ready for boarding at 5pm the day before the MileCatcher departs Horn Island.

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You will be required to disembark the vessel no later than 10 am on the last day of the course.

ie. In the case of the above example, 10am on the 14th of June.

If you have a late flight or check in at your hotel we are happy to store your luggage for you on the vessel until such time as you are ready to depart.

GETTING THERE

Closest airport - Horn Island Airport, Horn Island

Serviced by Qantas daily.

Transfers: There is a bus that meets every flight and will transfer you down to the ferry dock. There is a ferry that travels regularly between Horn Island and Thursday Island where you will meet the vessel.

ACCOMMODATION

Closest hotel luxury - The Jardine Motel, Thursday Island

The Jardine Motel is a 4 star property of 37 rooms. Set in tropical landscaped gardens, the motel is decorated with local indigenous artworks in the rooms and common areas. The beachfront location offers spectacular views across the brilliant blue seascape to the Prince of Wales and Horn Islands.

Guest facilities at the motel include a swimming pool, gift shop, guest laundry, Internet facilities and conference room.

Closest hotel budget - The Jardine Lodge, Thursday Island

Adjacent to the Jardine Motel is the 24 room Jardine Lodge which offers less formal accommodation at a reduced tariff. Rooms are available with or without ensuite facilities. All rooms are fully air-conditioned.

MileCatcher Itinerary 1

Hamilton Island, Whitsundays to Port Douglas, Far North Queensland (and vice versa)

Departing Hamilton Island, our route takes us approximately 400NM north to the luxurious resort town of Port Douglas.

Along the way you will stop at the outer Barrier Reef where you can enjoy the thrill of anchoring in the middle of the largest living organism on earth. A few stops can also take in island resorts and mainland towns.

See the following itinerary to give you an idea of what to expect along the way, subject to prevailing weather conditions.

The return voyage will take the same route in the reverse order providing weather conditions are suitable.

Day prior to departure

Arrive Hamilton Island. If required you can sleep aboard your MileCatcher yacht on the evening prior to your voyage commencing. The yacht is available from 5pm the day prior. You will be shown onboard, allocated a cabin and given a very basic briefing on the yacht.

Dining: Your choice of nine different restaurants and cafes on Hamilton Island.

Mooring: Marina

Day 1: 40NM

Commence briefings, provisioning shopping if required, assist crew to stow food for voyage. Today you will do a basic passage plan and get underway by lunch time. Your crew will run you through a safety briefing, man over board drill and sail you to your first night's anchorage. Day one is for settling in and getting your "sea legs".

A typical destination for night one would be Montys Resort (approx. 30NM).

Dining: Here you can go ashore for a drink if required. Basic resort facilities are available. Dinner onboard.

Mooring: At anchor

Day 2: 70NM

Extensive safety briefing and explanation of crew expectations, onboard rules and recommendations. The crew will explain your responsibilities and ask what your expectations and goals are for the trip and discuss how to achieve them.

It is normal for the crew to allocate a different skipper each day so each of you will have an opportunity to skipper for two days of the voyage. As skipper you can decide on the days passage plan, engine checks, boat checks, welfare of all onboard, cleanliness etc.

Around mid morning you will set sail for an overnight passage to Magnetic Island.

Dining: Eat onboard under sail

Mooring: Night sail

Day 3

Arrive Magnetic Island mid morning.

Opportunity to explore Magnetic Island which has a reasonably large township with restaurants, bars, clubs etc. You can hire mini mokes very cheaply and explore the island.

Dining: Eat onboard or ashore

Mooring: At anchor

Day 4: 50NM

Set sail for Orpheus Island via the Palm group of islands. There is an exclusive resort on Orpheus Island, but yacht passengers are not allowed ashore at the resort unless they intend to stay in-house. However away from the resort where we anchor, there are a number of lovely walks which take you up to a lookout which overlooks Hinchinbrook Island and the Palm Group (very stunning!). Snorkelling is also great around Orpheus.

Dining: Eat onboard **Mooring:** At anchor

Day 5: 60NM to Dunk Island, 40NM to Gould Island

Orpheus to Dunk Island via the Hinchinbrook Channel.

Hinchinbrook Island is Australia's largest National Park island. It is uninhabited except for the environmentally friendly Hinchinbrook Island Resort at Cape Richards. The island abounds in flora, fauna, palm-fringed beaches, mangrove waterways and rugged granite crags. The 39.3 sq. km island has a rich aboriginal history and was first seen by Europeans in 1770 when Captain Cook sailed past. Its rugged skyline is dominated by 1142m Mt. Bowen which towers over a rainforest wilderness, mangrove-lined shores and spectacular golden sandy ocean beaches.

The island has been separated from the mainland by the deep, narrow mangrove fringed Hinchinbrook Channel for around 100,000 years and has remained in relatively uninhabited, pristine condition.

It is this amazing passage that you will pass through. There is usually very little wind as the island protects the channel so it is often a motor sail whilst admiring the stunning view.

After departing the passage you will anchor at Dunk Island or Gould Island pending weather.

Dunk Island is a yacht friendly 4 star resort.

Dining: Eat onboard or ashore at Dunk Island. Eat onboard at Gould Island.

Mooring: At anchor

Day 6: 25NM

After a night at Dunk Island, if the weather is favourable, you will head out the outer Great Barrier Reef. There are many anchorages to choose from. You can swim, snorkel and explore the magic and seclusion of the reef. A very special opportunity.

Alternatively you may want to spend the day at Dunk Island, playing golf, swimming in pools, lakes, horse riding etc.

Dining: Eat onboard **Mooring:** At anchor

Day 7: 70NM

Outer Barrier Reef to Fitzroy Island off Cairns. Fitzroy Island has a back packer style resort which is yacht friendly.

Or depart Dunk Island late on day 6 and do an overnight sail to Fitzroy Island.

There are a number of alternatives in this area; Fitzroy Island, Green island, Michaelmas Cay.

Dining: Eat onboard or ashore at Dunk Island.

Mooring: At anchor

Day 8: 30NM

Spend day snorkelling and exploring Fitzroy Island, Green Island or Michaelmas Cay.

Dining: Eat onboard **Mooring:** At anchor

Day 9: 30NM

Fitzroy Island, Green Island or Michaelmas Cay to Low Isles off Port Douglas.

Low Isles has a light house but no shops or eateries. It has some great snorkelling and is a very popular day visit stop from Port Douglas.

Dining: Eat on board

Mooring: At anchor or on mooring

Day 10: 8NM

Arrive Port Douglas at approximately lunch time.

You may stay aboard your yacht for the final night. Port Douglas Marina has a large resort and the township has a great variety of shops and restaurants.

Dining: Final night meal

Mooring: In Port Douglas Marina Mirage

Day 11

Depart yachts at 9am

TOTAL MILEAGE: 400NM approx.

VESSEL: Jeanneau 45

MileCatcher Itinerary 2

Port Douglas, Far North Queensland to Horn Island, Cape York (and vice versa)

Departing Port Douglas, our route takes us approximately 500NM north to the very tip of Australia.

You will round famous Cape York Peninsula where you can go ashore and explore the remote northern point of Australia.

Along the way you will anchor in atolls on the Outer Barrier Reef, explore mainland river estuaries, and visit exclusive island resorts.

See the following itinerary to give you an idea of what to expect along the way.

The return voyage will take the same route in the reverse order providing weather conditions are suitable.

Day prior to departure

Arrive Port Douglas Marina Mirage.

If required you can sleep aboard your MileCatcher yacht on the evening prior to your voyage commencing. The yacht is available from 5pm the day prior. You will be shown onboard, allocated a cabin and given a very basic briefing on the yacht.

Port Douglas Marina has a large resort and the township has a great variety of shops and restaurants.

Dining: Your choice in Port Douglas.

Mooring: Marina

Day 1: 8NM

Commence briefings, provisioning shopping if required, assist crew to stow food for voyage.

Today you will do a basic passage plan and get underway by lunchtime. Your crew will run you through a safety briefing, man over board drill and sail you to your first nights anchorage. Day one is for settling in and getting your "sea legs".

A typical destination for night one would be Low Isles just a short sail from Port Douglas

Dining: Dinner onboard

Mooring: At anchor or on public mooring

Day 2: 40NM

Extensive safety briefing and explanation of crew expectations, onboard rules and recommendations. The crew will explain your responsibilities and ask what your expectations and goals are for the trip and discuss how to achieve them.

It is normal for the crew to allocate a different skipper each day so each of you will have an opportunity to skipper for two days of the voyage. As skipper you can decode on the days passage plan, engine checks, boat checks, welfare of all onboard, cleanliness etc.

Around mid morning if the weather is favourable you will set sail for Hope Isles on the Outer Great Barrier Reef. Awesome deserted Coral Cay.

Dining: Dinner onboard

Mooring: At anchor or on public mooring

Day 3: 30NM

Sail and explore Ribbon Reefs. Snorkelling etc.

Dining: Eat onboard **Mooring:** At anchor

Day 4: 50NM

Reef to Lizard Island.

There is an exclusive Resort on Lizard Island, but yacht passengers are not allowed ashore at the resort unless they intend to stay in-house. However away from the Resort there are a number of lovely walks and exploring that can be done. Snorkelling is also great around Lizard Island – some of the clearest cleanest water on earth.

Dining: Eat onboard **Mooring:** At anchor

Day 5: 100NM

Overnight sail to Flinders Islands or Princess Charlotte Bay, bushwalks to aboriginal caves etc.

Dining: Eat onboard **Mooring:** At anchor

Day 6: 60NM

Flinders Island to Morris Island surrounded by reef.

Dining: Eat onboard **Mooring:** At anchor

Day 7: 50NM

Flinders Island to Lockart River.

Dining: Eat onboard **Mooring:** At anchor

Day 8: 50-60NM

Lockart River to Margaret Bay or another Reef anchorage - weather dependent.

Dining: Eat onboard **Mooring:** At anchor

Day 9: 50-60NM

Sail to Escape River.

Dining: Eat onboard **Mooring:** At anchor

Day 10: 40NM

Sail through Albany Passage to the very tip of Australia.

Arrive Horn Island

Dining: Eat onboard **Mooring:** At anchor

Day 11

Depart yachts at 9am

Please note that on this trip there are no opportunities to top up the yachts water tanks. All crew and guests must be very careful with water usage and be prepared to conserve water along the way.
